Factors that Establish Residence of Child

How is the residence of a child determined?
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The determination is made not who they are living with but why they are living in the Grand Forks School District. You need to establish whether the child is residing in the district and whether such residence is for purposes other than merely educational.

1. The **Residency Form** is used to determine if the child is in the school district merely for the purpose of obtaining school privileges or for other reasons.
2. It is necessary to decide each student's status on a case-by-case basis. Once the residency form is completed, the building principal will make this determination.
3. The decision is one of the following:

Require Payment of Tuition

If the child is in the school district merely for the purpose of obtaining school privileges, then the law concerning the payment of tuition must be followed. Contact Mary Osowski at the district office to arrange for tuition payment.

No Payment of Tuition

If the child is in the school district for legitimate purposes other than availing themselves to the district's programs and facilities, then the child may attend school without the payment of tuition.

4. If you are uncertain when making this determination, please contact the appropriate Assistant Superintendent.
5. The documentation for verification of address (explained in the Welcome Letter of the Enrollment Packet) needs to show the name and address of where they are residing on the Residency Form.
